Step One: Listen to the Word: Listening today to this familiar story of Jesus calming the storm, what strikes you about it? What word or phrase caught your ear today?

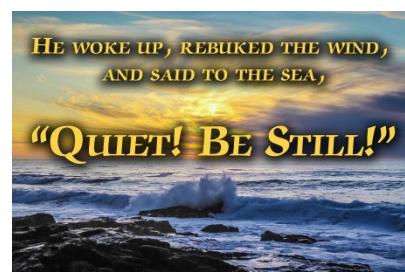
Step Two: Look into Your Life:

REFLECTIONS

GREAT, GREATER, GREATEST

“Was not the hand of the Lord upon him?” —Luke 1:66

St. John the Baptizer was born of a barren woman (Lk 1:7). His father, Zechariah, was deaf and dumb throughout the nine months of Elizabeth's pregnancy (Lk 1:20, 62). Zechariah was miraculously healed at John's circumcision (Lk 1:64). These astounding events surrounding the conception and birth of John the Baptizer prompted the question: "What will this child be?" (Lk 1:66)

The answers to this question are:

- 1) John the Baptizer was the "prophet of the Most High" (Lk 1:76).
- 2) He was the new Elijah (Lk 1:17; Mt 11:14).
- 3) "He was the lamp, set aflame and burning bright" (Jn 5:35).
- 4) John was "a voice in the desert, crying out: 'Make straight the way of the Lord!' " (Jn 1:23)
- 5) He was not "a reed swaying in the wind" or "someone luxuriously dressed" (Mt 11:7-8).
- 6) He was not worthy to unfasten Jesus' sandals (Acts 13:25).
- 7) John the Baptizer was the greatest person that had ever been born of woman up to that time (Mt 11:11). Yet you and I, "the least born into the kingdom of God," are greater than John (Mt 11:11). John the Baptizer was the greatest, but we are greater than the greatest because of what Jesus has done in our lives.

Prayer: Jesus, You are the Greatest, and I am in You and You in me (Jn 6:56).

Promise: "His mouth was opened and his tongue loosed, and he began to speak in praise of God." —Lk 1:64

Praise: "If you are prepared to accept it, he is Elijah, the one who was certain to come" (Mt 11:14). Lord Jesus, thank You for revealing the truth about St. John the Baptizer!

STAYING POWER

“Sir, if I may ask You this favor, please do not go on past Your servant.” —Genesis 18:3

Like Abraham, we can have the Lord right in front of us, but if we don't ask Him to stay, He may go right on past us. For example, when Jesus was walking on the water, He meant to pass by the apostles (Mk 6:48). But when they cried out to Him, Jesus "got into the boat with them and the wind died down" (Mk 6:51). Also, on Resurrection day, when Jesus had reached Emmaus with His two disciples, "He acted as if He were going farther. But they pressed Him: 'Stay with us'... so He went in to stay with them" (Lk 24:28-29).

In some ways, Jesus appears to be reserved and quiet, "not crying out, not shouting, not making His voice heard in the street. A bruised reed He shall not break, and a smoldering wick He shall not quench" (Is 42:2-3). He won't force Himself on you. He'll let you ignore Him or even crucify Him. He often whispers (1 Kgs 19:12), and sometimes is silent (Mt 27:12, 14). If you don't want Him around, He'll leave, shaking the dust from His feet (Mt 10:14). Jesus respects our freedom, almost too much. He'll let us reject Him forever. He'll even allow us to choose to be separated from Him forever. That's called hell.

Ask Jesus to stay the night with you, and even the day. Ask Him to stay forever. He says: "Here I stand, knocking at the door. If anyone hears Me calling and opens the door, I will enter his house" (Rv 3:20). Invite Him in.

Prayer: Jesus, give me the grace to get rid of anything that prevents You from staying with me.

Promise: "He expelled the spirits by a simple command." —Mt 8:16

Praise: Susan is a novice, preparing to pledge herself to Jesus, the Bridegroom, in consecrated religious life.

LETTER FROM BISHOP SOTO

Dear Friends in Christ:

Starting Friday, June 18, 2021, Pastors may accommodate the faithful for the celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass as well as other sacramental and worship services at 100% of the seating capacity in the parish churches.

I am rescinding the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Starting Sunday, June 20, 2021 all the Catholic faithful in the Diocese of Sacramento are obliged to personally attend and actively participate in the Sunday celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass (Canon 1247). Pastors and the faithful are counseled that individuals are not obligated to attend the Eucharist on Sunday or other obligatory solemnities if they are sick, have a vulnerable health condition, are caring for someone with a vulnerable health condition, or have other serious reasons (Canon 1245; Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2181).

All the faithful are reminded of the perennial obligation to keep holy the Lord's Day by observing Sunday with prayer, spiritual reflection, works of mercy, fellowship, and rest.

Pastors and the faithful should continue to observe sensible public health precautions:

- Practice frequent hand washing and use of hand sanitizer.
- Refrain from hand shaking and other forms of physical contact with others outside of one's household.
- Continue to clean the pews at least twice on Sundays and other days when there are multiple services.
- Facial masks are still encouraged.
- Priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers should continue to use facial masks for the distribution of communion. During the distribution of communion priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers should have sanitizer available for use when needed.

For communion, the distribution of the cup is still suspended.

The exchange of the **sign of peace** during Mass may resume. The faithful should refrain from gestures of physical touching with persons outside of one's household. **A respectful bow or wave is encouraged.**

Congregational singing may resume. Musicians and choirs should observe sensible public health precautions. Pastors should use their discretion based on local circumstances regarding the use of facial masks by musicians, cantors, and choirs.

Liturgical processions may resume: Entrance procession, the gospel procession, the procession of the offertory gifts, and the recessional procession.

It is recommended that the collection baskets be handled only by the ushers rather than passed from person to person.

Holy Water may be made available to the faithful in the traditional fonts at the entrance of the church.

Livestreaming the Sunday celebrations of the Sacrifice of the Mass for the benefit of those who cannot attend in person due to illness or other circumstances noted above is encouraged.

All the faithful are encouraged to receive the COVID-19 vaccination when available. Consult with your doctor regarding any personal health concerns.

Other ministerial, catechetical, and social gatherings may resume while also observing sensible public health precautions as outlined above. Pastors should take additional precautions for the handling of food and the provision of materials to avoid the use of shared utensils. Avoiding self-serve options for food and drink is encouraged.

The return to regular congregational gatherings will be welcomed by many. Mutual respect, charity and patience should be cheerfully exercised so that all the members of the Body of Christ are welcomed and encouraged by this blessed opportunity. Over the course of the long pandemic journey, we have learned the personal duty we have for one another's spiritual and physical health whenever we gather and even when we are apart. The risks of infection still threaten us. Our communion with the charity and mercy of Christ will help safeguard us and lead us on the path of holiness together.

May the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary and St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse, bring an end to the pandemic and fill us with the joy and hope of the Lord Jesus.

Cuando llegamos a la convicción de que desde que Uno murió por todos, todos murieron, suceden tres cosas:

- Ya no vivimos para nosotros sino para Aquel que murió por nosotros (2 Co 5:15).
- Ya no conocemos a nadie, incluso a Jesús, "con criterios puramente humanos" (2 Co 5:16).
- Somos impulsados por el amor en lugar de estar motivados por mezclas de miedo, orgullo y presión (2 Co 5:14).

Obviamente, alcanzar esta convicción de la muerte de Jesús y de nuestra muerte con Él es uno de los avances más importantes en la vida de una persona. Todo cristiano debería vivir esta comprensión, pero claramente muchos no la viven, o ya no vivirían para ellos mismos.

En este momento, pide al Espíritu Santo que te lleve a la cruz. Por medio de la cruz, el mundo estará crucificado para ti y tu para el mundo (Gál 6:14). El Espíritu confirmará, como solo Él puede, que nosotros, que hemos entregado nuestra vida al Señor, hemos sido crucificados con Él (Rom 6:6) y, por lo tanto, hemos crucificado nuestra carne con sus pasiones y deseos (Gál 5:24). Podemos "alcanzar esta convicción" solo por el Espíritu. Cuando lo hacemos, nos convertimos en cristianos no solo en nombre sino también en actitud, motivación y objetivo. Ya no vivimos para nosotros sino para Jesús.
