HOME COOKIN' | "On entering any house, first say, Peace to this house.' " —Luke 10:5

Jesus ministered in the temple and synagogue, on the mountain and at the lake, on the streets and in the desert. However, He chose none of these places to be the base for world evangelism. The chosen place for the ministry of Jesus Christ was, is, and always will be, the home.

The home is where it's at in God's plan of salvation. The large church building exists to serve the home-church and not vice versa. The home has priority. Dioceses, educational institutions, and international ministries are valid structures only insofar as they serve the church of the home.

For the first three hundred years of Christianity, every church was in a home. The Lord wanted to establish a home-centered Christianity. Insofar as we remember our roots in the home-church, we will see fulfillment of the Lord's Scriptural promises and world evangelism. If we forget our roots and our homes, we will surely fail.

Since the home is the basic structure and the very fabric of Christian life, Christianity is only as strong as its homes. We must restore the home as the center of Christian life. Seek the Spirit's guidance, take radical measures, make any sacrifices necessary to make your home a church-home. It's that important.

When care has made us poor by detaching us from the illusion of immortality, we can really become present to the elderly. We can then listen to what they say without worrying about how we can answer. We can pay attention to what they have to offer without being concerned about what we can give. We can see what they are in themselves without wondering what we can be for them. When we have emptied ourselves of false occupations and preoccupations, we can offer free space to old strangers, where not only bread and wine but also the story of life can be shared.

REFLECTIONS

WHAT'S THE SMOKE FOR?

Dear Johan,

When I called my parish to request the last rites for my mom, I was told we now call it the sacrament of the sick. And I should not have waited this long to request it. Can you help me understand?

Gentle Reader,

I hope they were nice about it. And indeed, there is a big difference between the two.

Before the Second Vatican Council, sacramental care of the sick was mostly limited to the very last moments of life. With much ceremony a priest visited a person at the end of his or her life. The priest first heard the dying person's confession. Following that he anointed the person with the oil of the sick. This was known as extreme unction. Finally, he would offer the dying person his or her last Communion or Viaticum. This Latin word implies that this would be the person's nourishment when making the journey from this life to the next. Because all of this happened at the end of a person's life, the combination of these three sacraments was known as the last rites. By the way, it was not unusual for a newly married couple to receive a last rites kit in the form of a cross as a wedding gift.

In light of the Second Vatican Council all the sacraments and liturgical celebrations were studied very carefully as to their theological meaning and historical accuracy. A major shift took place with regard to the last rites. Before the council, the sacrament was clearly seen as a passage rite accompanying the movement from this life to the next. Since then, the sacrament has been renamed to sacrament of the sick and is ranked with the sacrament of reconciliation as one of the sacraments of healing.

In the case of the sacrament of the sick, the notion of healing does not only refer to a bodily recovery, though that is clearly prayed for. Rather it implies a strengthening of the entire person (body, soul, and mind) in order to live fully within the limitations of the situation. The person may not be physically healed, but may be given the grace to embrace the illness and live as fully as possible.

When it comes to pastoral and sacramental care for those who are sick, we now have a much more inclusive approach. A person does not have to be on his or her deathbed to receive the sacrament. In addition, care has been broadened beyond the celebration of the sacrament and beyond the presence of ordained ministers.

I hope a priest was able to visit with you and your mom and celebrate the sacrament of the sick. I also hope your mom recovered from her illness. In the future, should she fall ill again, please don't hesitate to contact your parish not only so your mom may receive the sacrament but also so the parish may assist her and you during this difficult journey.

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BUILDING OUR FUTURE FUNDRAISER

We are currently planning to raise funds for a remodel project at Saint Theresa parish for our **sign and main office**. These need upgrades to provide better direction to our parish and safety and comfort for our parish staff and visitors.

New Sign. The current sign is not readily visible or readable from Lake Tahoe Boulevard and visitors have difficulty finding us. The font on the sign is too small and there is too much copy making it impossible to be read from cars driving down Highway 50 / Lake Tahoe Boulevard at the current 40 mile per hour speed limit.

The parish office is not accessible to persons with disabilities. It currently has steps outside leading to the front door and does not have a ramp making it difficult if not impossible for those with disabilities. There is one entry door and the only other door is from the customer side of the front counter. This is not only a fire hazard but unsafe for staff sitting behind the counter if someone looking to harm were to enter. The remodel would provide a safe exit for staff. The office is cramped and small and the remodel would provide additional working space. Moreover, the current restroom by the office is also small and is not accessible to persons with disabilities.

Knowing your own commitment to our parish's future, I invite you to share in our vision for a renewed and revitalized St. Theresa Parish by making a sacrificial donation toward Building our Future. Your donation would be a great start for this fundraiser. **Fr. Mauricio**

EL TIEMPO MISERICORDIOSO DE DIOS

"Cuando hicieron salir a la gente, Él entró, la tomó de la mano, y ella se levantó" | (Mateo 9:25).

El Señor escucha el grito de los pobres. En Su misericordia, "el Señor está cerca del que sufre y salva a los que están abatidos" (Sal 34:19). Cuando Jairo fue aplastado por la noticia de la muerte de su hija de doce años, Jesús la resucitó de entre los muertos (Mt 9:25) y convirtió la mayor tristeza de Jairo en su mayor gozo (ver Sal 30:6). Cuando una mujer que había estado sufriendo una hemorragia durante doce años había alcanzado "el extremo", tocó la borla de la capa de Jesús y recibió la sanidad y la misericordia de Dios al instante (ver Mt 9:20ss).

El hermano de Jacob estaba tan enojado con él que planeó matarlo (Gn 27:41) por lo que Jacob tuvo que salir de la ciudad. Mientras huía en el camino, el Señor en Su misericordia le dio a Jacob un sueño glorioso prometiéndole grandes cosas (Gn 28:12ss). Cuando la vida parece lo peor, el Señor revela lo mejor. El Señor da misericordia especial a las personas más quebrantadas y rechazadas.

Seamos misericordiosos como Jesús es misericordioso (Lc 6:36). Que tengamos misericordia con todos, especialmente con aquellos que están pasando por un tiempo en que se les da poca o ninguna misericordia.

Oración: Padre, que pueda amar a aquellos que se consideran no queridos.

Promesa: "¡Qué maravilloso es este lugar! ¡Es nada menos que la casa de Dios, y la puerta del cielo!" (Gn 28:17)

Si olvidamos nuestras raíces y nuestros hogares, seguramente fallaremos.

Como el hogar es la estructura básica y el tejido mismo de la vida cristiana, el cristianismo es tan fuerte como sus hogares.

Debemos restaurar el hogar como el centro de la vida cristiana. Busca la guía del Espíritu, toma medidas radicales, haz los sacrificios necesarios para que tu hogar sea un hogar de la iglesia. Es tan importante.

PROMOVIENDO LA VIDA | *El respeto por la vida es el camino a la paz*

El camino para la realización del bien común y de la paz pasa ante todo por el respeto de la vida humana, considerada en sus múltiples aspectos, desde su concepción, en su desarrollo y hasta su fin natural. Auténticos trabajadores por la paz son, entonces, los que aman, defienden y promueven la vida humana en todas sus dimensiones: personal, comunitaria y trascendente. La vida en plenitud es el culmen de la paz. Quien quiere la paz no puede tolerar atentados y delitos contra la vida.

Quienes no aprecian suficientemente el valor de la vida humana y, en consecuencia, sostienen por ejemplo la liberación del aborto, tal vez no se dan cuenta que, de este modo, proponen la búsqueda de una paz ilusoria. La huida de las responsabilidades, que envilece a la persona humana, y mucho más la muerte de un ser inocente e inerme, nunca podrán traer felicidad o paz. En efecto, ¿cómo es posible pretender conseguir la paz, el desarrollo integral de los pueblos o la misma salvaguardia del ambiente, sin que sea tutelado el derecho a la vida de los más débiles, empezando por los que aún no han nacido? Cada agresión a la vida, especialmente en su origen, provoca inevitablemente daños irreparables al desarrollo, a la paz, al ambiente. Tampoco es justo codificar de manera subrepticia falsos derechos o libertades, que, basados en una visión reductiva y relativista del ser humano, y mediante el uso hábil de expresiones ambiguas encaminadas a favorecer un pretendido derecho al aborto y a la eutanasia, amenazan el derecho fundamental a la vida.
